

Find the last good weekends of summer.

One prompt that searches what's actually on near you, prices it against the weekends you have left, and hands back a plan you can stick on the fridge. No apps. No forty open tabs.

Deal search

Weekend plan

Rain backups

Printable list

This kit gives you **two prompts** to paste into any AI chat. The first finds current local deals, buy one get one tickets, season passes and free programs, then lays them across the weekends before school starts. The second builds you a little interactive planner you can keep using. Each prompt shows a worked example beside a blank template to fill in.

BEFORE YOU START

How to use this kit

Three steps. That is it.

- 1 Open any AI chat that can **search the web**. That part matters. Without search it will guess, and guessed deals send you driving to things that ended last week.
- 2 Copy the prompt and **fill in the brackets**. Your city, your kids' ages, roughly what you can spend, how far you'll drive.
- 3 Read what comes back, then **check the prices yourself** on the venue's own page before you go. Deals move. More on this at the end.

Sweep for what's still on

Searches current offers near you, fits them to the weekends you have left, and tells you which pass pays for itself, what has a deadline, and what to skip.

EXAMPLE — WORKED THROUGH

I have 6 weekends left before school starts. Help me plan them.

Where we are: Ottawa, ON

Kids: 3 and 6

Budget: \$300 for the rest of summer

Max drive: 45 minutes each way

Work around: nap at 1pm, one kid hates crowds

Search for what's actually on right now:

- buy one get one or discounted admission
- season passes, and whether a pass beats paying at the gate
- free library passes, rec drop-ins, splash pads, festivals
- anything with a deadline before school starts

Then give me:

- a weekend by weekend plan inside the budget
- at least one genuinely free weekend
- a rain backup for each one
- which pass pays for itself, with the math
- one thing to cut, and why

Only use places and prices you actually found. If you can't verify a price, say so instead of guessing.

YOUR BLANK TEMPLATE

I have *[number]* weekends left before school starts. Help me plan them.

Where we are: *[city or postal code]*

Kids: *[ages]*

Budget: *[total for the rest of summer]*

Max drive: *[20 min / 45 min / an hour]*

Work around: *[naps, crowds, no pools, whatever is true]*

Search for what's actually on right now:

- buy one get one or discounted admission
- season passes, and whether a pass beats paying at the gate
- free library passes, rec drop-ins, splash pads, festivals
- anything with a deadline before school starts

Then give me:

- a weekend by weekend plan inside the budget
- at least one genuinely free weekend
- a rain backup for each one
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- one thing to cut, and why

Only use places and prices you actually found. If you can't verify a price, say so instead of guessing.

Take it further

Once the plan exists, this turns it into a small interactive planner you can open again, tick things off, and reprint. Ask for it in the same chat, right after the first prompt.

EXAMPLE — WORKED THROUGH

Turn that plan into a simple interactive page I can use.

What it needs:

- one card per weekend, in order
- a checkbox on each so I can tick it off
- the cost, the deal, any booking deadline, and the rain backup on each card
- the pass that pays for itself, and the thing to cut, at the bottom
- a print button that prints just the list, no clutter
- a copy button so I can paste it into a message

Design: calm and warm. Cream background, one accent colour, a serif for headings. Readable on a phone.

Keep every place and price exactly as you found it. Don't add anything new.

YOUR BLANK TEMPLATE

Turn that plan into a simple interactive page I can use.

What it needs:

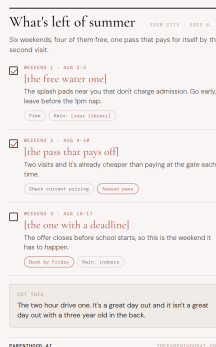
- one card per weekend, in order
- a checkbox on each so I can tick it off
- the cost, the deal, any booking deadline, and the rain backup on each card
- the pass that pays for itself, and the thing to cut, at the bottom
- a print button that prints just the list, no clutter

Design: *[describe the look you want, or say: calm and warm, easy to read on a phone]*

Keep every place and price exactly as you found it. Don't add anything new.

The finished list

Here's the shape of what comes back. Venue names sit where the brackets are once it's run for your own city.

PRO TIPS

Get more out of it

Make it something pretty

Paste the finished list into an image generator and ask for a poster version. Kids will actually look at a poster on the fridge. They will not look at a paragraph.

Ask for the boring stuff

Parking, washrooms, whether there's shade, how long it really takes. That's the difference between a good day and a meltdown at 2pm.

Give it your real constraints

Naps, one kid who hates noise, a car that's making a sound. The more honest the input, the less you have to cut afterwards.

Run it again in two weeks

New offers land all the time and old ones expire. It takes a minute to re-run and it catches whatever changed.

ONE THING BEFORE YOU DRIVE ANYWHERE

Check the price and the date on the venue's own page first. AI can be confidently wrong about a Saturday, and a festival that ended last week still shows up in old articles. Treat what comes back as a shortlist someone else researched for you, not a booking confirmation. It saves you the forty tabs. It doesn't replace the last thirty seconds of checking.
